Hazardous Weather/Act of God/Accident Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule. No refunds for cancellations of these types.

General Entry Information:

- This is a WDAA Recognized Show. WDAA membership is required for riders and owners of horses competing for WHLPAP or YEHP points. More information can be found at www.westerndressageassociation.org
- Amateur Status- if you are entering amateur classes, you will need to provide proof of amateur status with your entry. If you do not, you will be placed in the open division. Acceptable amateur certification includes: USEF Amateur cards or breed association amateur cards.
- Horses may be ridden by more than one rider. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with signatures and emergency contact information.
- Horses may not compete in the same test in a different division even with a different rider
- Horses may do no more than six tests/classes
- Horses may only compete in adjacent levels with the same rider.
- Negative Coggins (12 months for in-state horses; 6 months for out-of-state horses) and Equine Influenza vaccinations/Equine Herpesvirus (6 months) are required with entry. Please use the USEF Vaccination form which can be found at this link [equine-vaccination-record \(usef.org\)](http://equine-vaccination-record.usef.org)
- Scores will be posted in the show office
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of scores
- Scoring errors must be reported to show secretary within one hour of official posting of the class where the score was earned
- Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers for horse, rider, trainer before the day of competition. Scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Awards

- Rosettes to 6th place will be awarded in all classes. Classes may be split between Open, Amateur, and Jr/YR. Gaited horses will be in their own classes along with therapeutic/physically challenged.
- Show high score awards will be offered for Intro-Level 1 and Level 2-5. An overall High Score Buckle is sponsored by J-Bar Stables and will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the highest score at any level. Freestyles and rail classes do not count toward high score awards.
- Ties will not be broken

GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee

WDAA Horse Lifetime Performance & Award Program

WDAA supports a Lifetime Performance & Award Program (WHL PAP). This is a point-tracking system awarding cumulative milestone achievements to horses competing in Western Dressage. Enrolled horses earn points by competing in tests and rail classes at WDAA recognized shows. Class placings and percentages are converted to a point system, which follows the horse as they travel up the levels on their journey.

The program was designed to be approachable and realistic for every horse and rider, regardless of their stage of training. The Lifetime Performance & Award Program follows the WDAA mission statement, values the partnership between horse and rider, and encourages a systematic education developing both the physical and mental abilities of the horse. The program does not require extensive travel nor significant financial investment; instead rewarding training, participation and performance. Points follow the horse and transfer to new owners.

The result is a record system celebrating attainable goals that further the relationship of horse and rider within the Western Dressage system. Competition Rules

- Bridle Numbers- All horses (competing and non-competing) must wear show numbers when out of the stall
- Dogs- Dogs are allowed on the grounds but must be on a leash/restrained at all times. They are not allowed near the show ring or warm up ring. They must be quiet and mannerly.
- Attire: Please see the USEF Western Dressage Section of the rule book for permitted attire. (WD 123)
- Sharps Containers will be available in the stabling barn (GR1210.4)
- Non-Competing Horses are allowed on the grounds if space is available. The owner must fill out an entry form and pay stall and non-competing fees.
- Please visit the show website at www.cadsdressage.org for up to date biosecurity measures.
- "EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

Scheduling

- Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine, or cancel classes, and modify the schedule to make changes required by the competition specification herein
- Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management.
- Musical Freestyle Sound Check will be before the start of the show or during lunch break of the show; depending on the ride times of freestyles.
- Provisional Ride Times and stabling assignments will be available on www.cadsdressage.org the Wednesday prior to the show.
- Day Sheets will be posted in the office at noon the day prior to the show with official ride times. This may reflect changes made to the provisional ride times.

Arenas

- An outdoor 20x60 meter standard dressage arena inside a larger fenced arena will be used for the competition ring. Footing is sand with drainage.
- Warm up is available in an indoor dressage arena that is slightly narrower than a standard competition arena and in a sand arena near the competition ring. The indoor ring and outdoor rings are at opposite ends of the stabling barn and are connected by paved driveways.

Stabling

- Permanent stabling of stalls that are 10'x10' or larger are available. Doors are full length, sliding, and have regular latches.

Directions

- From I-77 or I-80, take the Brecksville Rd exit. Head north on Brecksville Road to Valley Parkway. Turn Right on Valley Parkway. Turn Right on Cleveland Metro Parkway. Brecksville Stables is on the right at 11921 Parkview Dr, Brecksville, OH 44141
- Smaller trucks/trailers can enter on Parkview Dr, which is the road before Valley Parkway. However, there is no light at the intersection of Brecksville Rd/Parkview Dr so it is not recommended
